## CCHR to Launch its Human Rights Education Platform: Freedom of Expression

CCHR's project 'Promoting Independent Media and Freedom of Expression in Cambodia' ("PRIME") is pleased to launch its **Human Rights Education Platform: Freedom of Expression**, with three online modules related to freedom of expression in order to build the public's knowledge on the right to freedom of expression, access to information, and independent media. Each module includes a series of videos, infographics, and interactive quizzes that detail the right to freedom of expression, access to information, and independent media.

The launch will be held online on Tuesday 13 July 2021 from 1:30 to 5:00 p.m.

The aims of this event are:

- To raise awareness amongst the public on the rights to freedom of expression, access to information and independent media;
- To showcase CCHR's infographics and videos from these modules; and
- To interact with online quizzes on the rights to freedom of expression, access to information and independent media.

The event will start with a welcome remark by CCHR's Executive Director, Mrs. Chak Sopheap, and then proceed with a presentation of the three modules on CCHR's Human Rights Portal, https://sithi.org/foe. Afterwards, CCHR's PRIME project team will play the videos produced for each module. Following the presentation of the modules, online quizzes on freedom of expression, access to information and independent media will be distributed to the participants who will be able to win a tumbler water bottle inscribed with the quote "We Stand for Freedom of Expression". The event will end with a closing remark by Mrs. Chak Sopheap.
