Outcomes of the ASEAN Post Ministerial Conference (PMC) 10+1 Sessions with the Dialogue Partners

On 26 July 2024, His Excellency Deputy Prime Minister SOK Chenda Sophea, Minister of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation of the Kingdom of Cambodia, attended the ASEAN Post Ministerial Conference (PMC) 10+1 Sessions with Dialogue Partners of ASEAN, namely Australia, Canada, China, the European Union, India, Japan, New Zealand, Republic of Korea, Russian Federation, and the United Kingdom (UK).

During the Meetings, **His Excellency SOK Chenda Sophea** emphasised the following key points:

• On economic cooperation, the Deputy Prime Minister underscored that promoting economic ties and fostering trade and investments in and between the regions remain a key pillar in our relations with external partners. Thus, he encouraged the full and effective utilization of the existing Free Trade Agreements (FTA) that ASEAN has with some Dialogue Partners and the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership (RCEP) to further deepen regional integration and bring greater benefits for our peoples. He also underlined the need for ASEAN to work with other Dialogue Partners to create more FTAs and to improve market access, harmonize regulatory frameworks and enhance business-to-business linkages.

- To ensure rapid and durable growth, the Deputy Prime Minister urged ASEAN and Dialogue Partners to tap into the great potentials of emerging industries such as digital economy, green transition, resilient supply chains, and sustainable tourism. Among some of the most important priorities across the three community pillars, he placed a heavy emphasis on the Digital Economy Framework Agreement, the first region-wide digital economy agreement in the world, which is expected to be adopted next year, the development of a resilient, sustainable and smart ASEAN Power Grid, and better utilization of renewable, green and low-carbon energy.
- The Deputy Prime Minister took the opportunity to express appreciation to all Dialogue Partners for their unwavering support to ASEAN's efforts in further enhancing regional connectivity. In this regard, he invited Dialogue Partners to continue contributing to this endeavour, including through their support for the implementation of the Master Plan on ASEAN Connectivity (MPAC) 2025 and its successor document. The Deputy Prime Minister stressed that a resilient and interconnected region will ensure that ASEAN remains a key driver in regional and global growth.
- The Deputy Prime Minister also underscored that ASEAN needs to build an
 ecosystem to help realize these visions by investing in human capital
 development in order to ensure that our peoples are equipped with the 21st
 century skills that allow them to thrive in the future, making our Micro, Small
 and Medium Enterprises competitive, productive and resilient, and facilitating
 the adoption of technology and digital tools. In addition, he also thanked
 Dialogue Partners for their continued support for the implementation of the Initiative
 for ASEAN Integration (IAI) Work Plan IV (2021-2025), which contribute to our
 efforts to narrow the development gap in the region.
- The Deputy Prime Minister also expressed appreciation to Dialogue Partners for their support for ASEAN Centrality, and the ASEAN Outlook on Indo Pacific (AOIP), which serves as a guiding document in our engagement with partners in the Asia-Pacific and the Indian Ocean regions. Moreover, he encouraged Dialogue Partners to contribute to the AOIP through tangible and concrete projects in the four priority areas identified in the AOIP through ASEAN mechanisms for our mutual benefit.
