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**Statement
of the Spokesperson of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and International Cooperation
Cambodia Reaffirms Its Determination to Combat All Forms of Transnational Crimes**

The Royal Government of Cambodia reaffirms its strong commitment to combating and suppressing all forms of transnational crimes, including online scam, human trafficking and other cyber-enabled offenses that threaten the safety, dignity, and welfare of individuals.

Under the leadership of **Samdech Thipadei Hun Manet**, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Cambodia, the Cambodian competent authorities have made significant achievement in dismantling criminal networks and bringing perpetrators to justice.

Recognizing the Complexity of the Challenge

Online crime today is increasingly **transnational and technologically sophisticated**. Criminal networks operate across multiple jurisdictions, exploiting encrypted communications, digital currencies, and transnational recruitment chains that make the difference between victims and perpetrators less clear. Many individuals trapped in scam compounds are themselves victims of trafficking and coercion.

Cambodia stresses the importance of **distinguishing genuine victims from criminals**, ensuring that responses are **humane, proportionate, and just**. We also underscore that **sensational or misleading narratives** can unfairly stigmatize workers and migrant communities. Cambodia therefore calls for **responsible and factual communication** that supports law enforcement while protecting vulnerable populations.

Measures Undertaken and Tangible Results in the Fight Against Online Crimes

Over the past two years, Cambodia has intensified nationwide operations to identify, investigate, and dismantle online scam networks. These efforts include:

- Strengthening and enforcing laws against trafficking, cybercrime, fraud, and money laundering, while updating regulations on digital evidence and asset recovery.
- Enhancing inter-agency coordination among the competent authorities.
- Conducting targeted inspections, raids, and arrests of ringleaders and facilitators, while seizing criminal assets such as cash, cryptocurrencies, vehicles, and properties.
- Expanding 24/7 hotlines and shelters, providing psychosocial, medical, and legal support to victims, and ensuring the non-criminalization of coerced victims.

The Government has further **enhanced its legal and institutional frameworks**, strengthened inter-agency coordination, and enacted updates to laws on cybercrime, anti-money laundering, and human trafficking.

The Government is implementing stronger cyber-crime prevention measures, including new inter-ministerial coordination mechanisms, enhanced digital surveillance, and the suspension of websites and business licenses linked to illegal operations.

The Government has also taken decisive administrative actions, including the revocation of 120 business licenses, suspension of over 1,000 gambling-related websites, and freezing of illicit bank accounts linked to digital fraud schemes. Enhanced cooperation with foreign embassies has facilitated the identification and repatriation of victims, as well as the exchange of intelligence on regional cyber-criminal groups.

The Cambodian law enforcement agencies have conducted numerous targeted operations across the country. These actions have led to the **closure of multiple illegal compounds**, the **arrest of hundreds of suspects**, and the **rescue and protection of Cambodian and foreign victims** of online exploitation.

Moving forward, Cambodia is establishing a national cyber-crime task force, upgrading digital-forensics capacity, and working with all partners to strengthen cross-border enforcement and cyber-governance frameworks. These results underscore Cambodia's firm commitment to eradicating online crimes, safeguarding digital integrity, and promoting a safer regional cyberspace.

Strengthening International Cooperation

Cambodia continues to work closely with its **regional and international partners**, including the **Republic of Korea, China, and ASEAN member states**, through **joint investigations, intelligence sharing, and mutual legal assistance**. These partnerships have produced tangible results—such as the disruption of major scam operations, successful prosecutions of organized crime figures, and the repatriation of foreign victims to their home countries.

At the same time, Cambodia calls on international media and stakeholders to ensure **accurate, fair, and evidence-based reporting** that promotes cooperation rather than division.

Cambodia and the Republic of Korea: A Shared Commitment

The Ministry expresses its **deep regret and condolences** regarding the recent tragic incidents involving Korean nationals who have fallen victim to online employment scams and related crimes in Cambodia. The Royal Government of Cambodia conveys its heartfelt sympathy to the families of the victims, and to the Government and people of the Republic of Korea.

During the recent meeting between **Samdech Thipadei Hun Manet** and **Her Excellency Kim Jina**, Second Vice Minister of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Korea, both sides reaffirmed their shared commitment to combating transnational crimes, particularly online scams. The Prime Minister praised the **fruitful cooperation** between Cambodia and Korea and expressed readiness to strengthen joint efforts to prevent, suppress, and dismantle criminal networks more effectively.

Samdech Prime Minister emphasized that the two countries possess the necessary capacity and mechanisms to address these issues bilaterally, reaffirming that the partnership is rooted in mutual respect, equality, and trust. Cambodia welcomes continued dialogue and cooperation with the Republic of Korea to advance shared goals for regional stability, security, and prosperity.

Vice Minister Kim Jina also held discussions with senior officials from both the Ministry of Interior and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs on future cooperation between the two countries in their joint efforts to combat all forms of online crime. She was subsequently briefed on the measures undertaken and the significant results achieved in the fight against such crimes.

Future Cooperation

Looking ahead, Cambodia will continue to strengthen **law enforcement capacity, legislative frameworks, and regional partnerships** under the ASEAN framework. The Kingdom will sustain its enforcement momentum through expanded inspections, stronger financial-crime taskforces, and enhanced public awareness campaigns.

Cambodia's message is clear: "Criminals exploit technology and borders; our response must be equally connected and coordinated." Through **cooperation—not blame**— the Kingdom of Cambodia will continue to pursue kingpins, protect victims, and preserve peace, order, and dignity for all.
